Item	Subject	Rules and Other Governing Provisions
10	Routing Application	The rates named herein apply only via The Alaska Railroad and only on equipment operated in joint passenger and vehicle service.
20	Application of Rates	<p>The rates shown below will apply on buses, ordinary passenger automobiles and accompanying automobile trailer, subject to the following conditions:</p> <p>The vehicles must not be intended for sale, delivery or demonstration purposes. Only one passenger automobile and trailer will be checked for any one passenger. Vehicle will be handled if space and conditions permit. Vehicles may only contain passenger's legitimate baggage, personal equipment and/or sportsmen's and camping equipment but no goods for resale.</p> <p>Passengers will remain in vehicle while train is in motion.</p> <p>Passenger must be prepared to immediately load or unload from or to railcar at point of origin or destination. Driver of the vehicle is to be responsible for any damage to his vehicle or other vehicles in the process of loading or unloading. Likewise, he is to be responsible for the proper setting of the brakes while his vehicle is on the railcar.</p> <p>The charges named herein do not cover articles or attachments left in the automobile or automobile trailer and the Railroad will not be liable for loss or damage to any such attachments, however caused.</p> <p>Except as otherwise provided, vehicles may not exceed eight (8) feet in width when ten (10) feet in height; or seven (7) feet in width when eleven (11) feet in height above the ground level. Vehicles in excess of these measurements must be cleared through the office of the Superintendent of Transportation.</p> <p>Tickets must be purchased through Passenger Agent at Anchorage or Portage or from Train Conductor. No reservations will be accepted BUT priority loading will be given holders of tickets for movement from or to points beyond via vessels of the Alaska State Ferry System.</p>
25	Freight, Property or Vehicles not Authorized	Vehicles, freight or property (other than provided for in Item 20) when offered for transportation will be handled at the rates named in Item 120. Such freight or property must be loaded in the vehicle and The Alaska Railroad will not be liable for loss or damage, however caused. The vehicles will only be accepted for transportation, pending the availability of space after all tourist traffic has been satisfied. The rates will include passage for driver only and any other passengers in the vehicle will be charged at rates named in Item 110. Explosives and other hazardous materials will not be allowed on this train except as specifically provided for in Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations Chapter 1, Sub Chapter C, Hazardous Materials Regulations.
30	Baggage, Property or Other Articles	Baggage or property, not in vehicles, tendered for handling aboard train baggage car will be charged applicable baggage rates as found in Local Passenger and Baggage Tariff 85 Series, supplements thereto and reissues thereof.
